### **Plate Sharing**

### I. <u>POLICY STATEMENT</u>

The First Parish Church Place Sharing Policy was first approved by the Board of Trustees 01.12.2014. This revision states that Plate Sharing decisions are voted on by the entire congregation.

#### II. <u>SCOPE</u>

This policy covers the distribution of non-pledge donations, usually collected weekly at the Sunday service, but includes all non-pledge donations that are marked "plate".

Each week, one half of the non-pledge offering of cash and checks received in the plate is given to a worthy local, national, or international charity previously chosen by the congregation. FPC keeps the second half.

Charities are chosen through a survey sent to the congregation by the Social Justice Council.

The nine organizations who receive the most votes on an online survey are given a month during the church year, that is September through May. The remaining organizations will split the total of the summer offering.

There will be an announcement from the pulpit and/or in the Sunday 'Order of Service' as to which charity is being supported in that specific month.

When writing a check, it would be helpful to write in the memo line how the gift to be applied (pledge, split, church only).

#### III. <u>RESPONSIBILITY</u>

The Social Justice Council (SJC)oversees plate sharing charity decisions.

The Social Justice Council primarily receives suggestions for charities from Social Justice Task Forces, although any church member can be a sponsor. The SJC reviews suggestions for a charity as presented by an FPC sponsor who is actively involved with the charity. The sponsor must be willing to provide educational and promotional support material.

A 'worthy charity' proposal should include:

1) a name and a stated purpose or mission.

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- explanation about how this project relates to social justice priority criteria established by the Council. Initiatives should accomplish one or more of the following:
  - a) Increase awareness of social justice issues within the church community and beyond;
  - b) Grow the Church's denominational connections;
  - c) Act locally but seek far-reaching effects;
  - d) Involve some kind of hands-on, direct service;
  - e) Involve youth; increase their awareness of social justice issues.
- 3) description of specific activities involved in what's proposed.

The SJC recommends a list of charities to the congregation. The congregation votes on which charities to support in the upcoming year. (Currently, a Survey Monkey survey is emailed to the congregation.)

The minister assigns a specific month to each selected charity and notifies the charity.

The Treasury Team (TT) deposits into a special account income from the previous Sunday Collection Plate sources: ½ of the cash and ½ of the undesignated non-pledge checks, split checks, plus checks or cash specifically designated for the charity. Additional checks from donors may also be deposited.

At month's end the Treasurer gives the minister a check, which they will send with a cover letter to the charity.

The Treasury Team will contact the donors of larger non-pledge amounts to determine the donor's intention if there is no indication in the check memo line.

### IV. <u>DEFINITIONS</u>

Plate collections are defined as non-pledge donations. The term plate refers to the passing of the collection plate during the church service, but it also includes all non-pledge donations marked "plate."

Plate Sharing is defined as 50% of the plate collection provided to the charity approved for that month.
