

Massachusetts Department of Correction (DOC), offering educational programs that focus on skill-building and personal growth, essentials to help support people in prison to achieve success while incarcerated or post-incarceration.

## Piano Concert: 200 Years of Women Composers

Featuring Trevor Berens, piano. Music includes works by Amy Beach, Clara Schumann, Marti Epstein, and Florence Price. Suggested donation: \$5–\$40. Tickets available at the door and in advance at <u>Eventbrite</u>.

Trevor Berens presents a concert of music written by women, from 1836 through 2005. The music is as varied as it is beautiful, from Clara Schumann's early suite

of short works inspired by the music of Chopin ("Soirées Musicales") to Marti Epstein's minimalist pieces written at the turn of this century (selections from "American Etudes"). Trevor will also be performing, in its entirety, Florence Price's rarely heard set of four dances, "Dances in the Canebrakes", as well as music by the early twentieth-century American composer, Amy Beach.

The Racial Justice Task Force will be hosting a discussion online as part of our "drop in" sessions. Our guest speaker will be Mac Hudson from the Prisoners Legal Services of Massachusetts, and he will be talking about his work with the Racial Equity in Corrections Initiative. REICI is an organization-wide initiative offered through Prisoner Legal Services, a nonprofit and anti-racist organization that advocates equity and the humane treatment of incarcerated people in the Commonwealth. We'll watch a short documentary, followed by a presentation by


