Please sign up online and indicate how many bags of apples you intend to peel. Apples can be picked up on Wednesday afternoons after 4 pm. PLEASE ONLY TAKE AS MANY BAGS AS YOU SIGNED UP TO TAKE.

The apples will be located in bins located IN FRONT OF **STALL 4** OF THE CARRIAGE SHED.

Volunteers are asked to take the apples home, wash them, peel them, core them, and cut them into pie slices. Bags for the cleaned apple slices to be stored in will be provided.

Drop off bags of prepared apple in the bins at the church before 9 pm

Thursday. (NOTE: If you peel your apples on Wednesday, please refrigerate them until you deliver them on Thursday.)

#### Friday Morning: Baking

Sign up for early or late shifts (see sign up for times). You are welcome to sign up for two shifts if you plan to stay for the duration of pie making on a given Friday. All TRAINING WILL BE PROVIDED.

#### Friday Evening: Bagging

Bagging will take place in the Fellowship Hall. All baggers will be asked to wear masks in the building.

We will again be selling at the front doors of the church. Pies will be \$18. Sellers will be asked to wear a mask,

regardless of vaccination status and will be provided with gloves to wear.
