At <u>The Food Project</u>, we believe that everyone has the right to fresh, healthy, affordable food. Our goal is to transform the food system into a more just, community-engaged model that supports food security for all while connecting diverse communities to each other and to the land.

Young people are the driving force of The Food Project. They work on our farms and with community members to realize the

right to food that nourishes our communities and the planet we share. Each summer, we employ 140 teenagers on 70 acres of urban and suburban farmland in Lincoln, Wenham, Boston, and Lynn. On Saturdays throughout the academic year, a smaller cohort builds raised bed gardens, leads educational workshops, and learns together about food and social justice.

We focus our food security efforts on the two communities we are most deeply connected to: Boston's Dudley neighborhood and the City of Lynn. https://thefoodproject.org/

South East India Project is collecting donations of vitamins and photos

We are again collecting items for the children at WIDE Children's Home, an orphanage for Dalit children (formerly Untouchables) in SE India. It has, however, become difficult to put together friendship kits (four, 50-lb boxes) and transport them all the way to India, which requires many hours of arduous travel. We want to



make this a bit easier by collecting only the usual photos of your families plus a year's worth of children's vitamins (in large plastic jars) and a year's worth of toothpaste. We will attempt to pick up other items in India. We would like it if you (and your child) would include letters in which you can tell a little about yourselves and receive back a photo and perhaps a letter from a child in India. This could spark meaningful conversation around the kitchen table. We will begin collecting photos, toothpaste, and vitamins today after service today.
