At <u>The Food Project</u>, we believe that everyone has the right to fresh, healthy, affordable food. Our goal is to transform the food system into a more just, community-engaged model that supports food security for all while connecting diverse communities to each other and to the land.

Young people are the driving force of The Food Project. They work on our farms and with community members to realize the right to

food that nourishes our communities and the planet we share. Each summer, we employ 140 teenagers on 70 acres of urban and suburban farmland in Lincoln, Wenham, Boston, and Lynn. On Saturdays throughout the academic year, a smaller cohort builds raised bed gardens, leads educational workshops, and learns together about food and social justice.
