December Plate Sharing




FPC Guest Table started serving a free monthly community dinner in Fellowship Hall in November 2015. It is a sit-down meal consisting of salad, entree, and dessert. We have served anything and everything from pizza to salmon. Volunteers plan, shop, set up, clean up, prepare, and serve the meal. After dinner is served, the leftovers are put in to-go containers and given to guests to take home.

It costs about \$250 a month to put on a meal, and the largest portion of that expense is food. Our primary sources of

funding are the Stow Community Chest and the plate-share from this congregation. In addition to being a resource for those with food insecurity, we are also a resource for those who want a night off from planning and cooking a meal, and/or for those who typically dine alone in their homes. Guest Table is a welcoming community for ALL, and we invite you to come dine with us on the second Friday of every month in Fellowship Hall.
