## Plate Sharing This Month: Supporting Asylum Seekers



The Supporting Asylum Seekers group is an active part of the Social Justice work of FPC. We work to support asylum seekers and refugees who seek a safe home in our surrounding communities. We greatly appreciate the Congregation's ongoing support and plate sharing!

This past year we have extensively helped a local family of 4 from Honduras. We raised money to hire a lawyer, who has filed and will represent them in their Asylum case. We have given funds for rent, and provided transportation, English language lessons, caring, advice, and friendship.

We also coordinate with UU Mass Action, the UU Service Committee, and UUSJ (UUs for Social Justice - UU Advocacy in the Nation's Capital) to work for political change toward our UU values, in our state and nation.

We have also expanded to help local Afghan evacuees/refugees and partnered with other area churches to sponsor and support these families. We meet by Zoom on the 1<sup>st</sup> Mondays of each month, and all are invited to join us for a meeting or for any of our actions. Dear FPC Community,

The UU Principles are part of the UUA Bylaws (in Article II), and as such they are periodically reviewed. The Article II Commission has released a draft proposal for Article II revisions, and it is available here:

There are several sessions for feedback to the Article II Commission from now until Nov. 14 listed here:

<https://www.uua.org/uuagovernance/committees/article-ii-study-commission>, as well as a form to submit with feedback for those who cannot make it to the feedback sessions. This will all result in a new draft that will be released in December. The final draft in January will go to the UUA General Assembly for a first vote this June, and a second vote, if the first is successful, the following year.

This draft is a revision of all of Article II, and it replaces the Principles with a section titled "Values and Covenant." As you might imagine, I have lots of opinions about it. I bet you will too! I've scheduled an online session Sunday at 4pm for us to learn more about this proposal and discuss it. The link is repeated in *This Week at FPC*, our Friday email.
