

The Supporting Asylum Seekers group is an active part of the Social Justice work of FPC. We work to support asylum seekers and refugees who seek a safe home in our surrounding communities. We greatly appreciate the Congregation's ongoing support and

plate sharing!

This past year we have extensively helped a local family of 4 from Honduras. We raised money to hire a lawyer, who has filed and will represent them in their Asylum case. We have given funds for rent, and provided transportation, English language lessons, caring, advice, and friendship.

We also coordinate with UU Mass Action, the UU Service Committee, and UUSJ (UUs for Social Justice - UU Advocacy in the Nation's Capital) to work for political change toward our UU values, in our state and nation.

We have also expanded to help local Afghan evacuees/refugees and partnered with other area churches to sponsor and support these families.
